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Giant anteaters open ant and termite hills with big claws. Then they catch the insects with their long, sticky tongues. Their stomachs crush the food.

Hummingbirds use their tongues to take in a sweet liquid from flowers. It's called nectar. They also catch small bugs.

Parrots have strong beaks. They use them to crack open nuts and

beak like moats. Alligator snapping turtles have a part on their tongue that looks like a worm. This draws prey right into the mouth!

Some whales have no teeth. They have plates called baleen. These look a bit like brushes. A baleen whale takes water into its mouth and lets it out through the baleen. The baleen catches tiny ocean creatures. Then the whale swallows them. Yum!
